#### III. VISION STATEMENT



The strategic and prime development hub of the south, a city managed through good governance, with an empowered citizenry that thrives in a highly competitive economy, and a sustainable environment that nurtures its diversity and multi-cultural heritage towards a resilient, progressive, and inclusive future.

#### IV. DEVELOPMENT GOALS, OBJECTIVES, AND STRATEGIES

The sectoral goals used for the **2022-2025 Executive Legislative Agenda (ELA)** were based on the city's **Updated 2020-2025 Comprehensive Development Plan/Comprehensive Development Investment Program (CDP-CDIP)**. The ELA includes the substantial outputs from the series of workshops participated by representatives of civil society organizations (CSOs) and executive offices of the City Government. In addition, the consolidated CSO and executive development concerns fed into the discussion of the ELA elements among the members of the 20th City Council. The process resulted to the identified critical development issues that must be given attention and priority by the city government for the next three years.

The current administration's development agenda acronymed **RISE CDO**<sup>1</sup> guided the review of the city's development goals, objectives, and strategies to enable the formulation of a more responsive programs, projects, and activities for all Kagayanons.

The fully devolved functions under the **Devolution Transition Plan (DTP) 2022-2024** were also considered in the identification of legislative interventions to complement the efforts of the executive department. These interventions are addressed according to the prescribed five (5) sectoral concerns, namely, Economic Development, Social Development, Environment Management, Infrastructure Development, and Institutional Development.

- 1. Increase public investments in support infrastructure to promote socioeconomic growth
- 2. Faster pace of infrastructure projects implementation
- 3. Build DRR-CCA-compliant infrastructure facilities
- 4. Promote more active community engagement or partnership in social-related infrastructure (school buildings, hospitals, daycare centers, etc)
- 5. Maintain stronger coordinative linkages with national agencies in terms of program/project identification, complementation, and implementation
- 6. Promote urban growth dispersal through more responsive road projects, transportation systems and telecommunication facilities

#### **Development Strategies**

In order to achieve its targets, the City Government crafted strategies designed to achieve and accomplish its set targets. The following are the identified actions or interventions that this sector will adopt for the next six (6) years:

- 1. **Systems and Processes Enhancement Strategies** these refers to activities that aim to improve, update, and develop systems and processes needed to deliver services required. Under this strategy, the City Government will further utilize technology to institutionalize mechanisms that promotes seamless streaming of cross-office processes and procedure, and this would include automation and streamlining of systems and processes.
- 2. **Competency Development Strategies** these refers to activities that aim to enhance, strengthen, and develop knowledge, skills, and attitudes needed to effectively and efficiently deliver services required from personnel of the city. This strategy is essential in improving the quality of required outputs, consequently optimizing productivity. These may be delivered through trainings, mentoring, coaching, benchmarking, and exchange studies.
- 3. **Linkage / Network Strengthening Strategies** these strategies refer to activities that will develop and strengthen both internal and external linkage and network of the City Government. Under this strategy, the City Government will continuously strengthen and build its strong linkage to generate support and assistance, improve service delivery, and promote local investments.



During the period 2019 – 2020, the city's GCDP decreased by **Php21.003 billion** equivalent to a negative year-on-year growth at **-8.8%**, but the city posted positive growth by generating **Php20.983 billion** between 2020 – 2021, equivalent to **9.6%** year-on-year growth, besting the region's five (5) provinces and Iligan City (the other highly urbanized city in the region). Recall to mind that the COVID-19 pandemic broke out early in 2020. The city was not spared. In order to balance public health welfare and economic sustainability, the City Government implemented a novel approach of granular lockdown of areas with virus-positive cases in order to contain the potential wider spread of viral infection to larger communities.


The Gross City Domestic Product (GCDP) accounts include three (3) key economic functions, namely, (1) Agriculture, Forestry, and Fishing or AFF, (2) Industry, and (3) Services. In 2021, **Services** contributed the largest share to the city's economy at Php billion 179.2 billion, followed by **Industry** at Php 58.2 billion, and **AFF** at Php 1.7 billion.
